If you are interested in going on to further education there are some colleges that have been set up specifically for people with autism and Asperger's Syndrome. The NAS Autism Helpline has a list of these.

In addition, there are a number of universities that do support people with Asperger's Syndrome. The best option is to contact a university you are interested in directly and ask them.

You may be eligible for Disabled Students' Allowance from your Local Education Authority.
