Sheet Title: Strategies for Social Behaviour

o Learn how to:

- Start, maintain and end social play
- Be flexible, co-operative and share
- Maintain solitude without offending others
- o Explain what the child should have done
- o Encourage a friend to play with the child at home
- o Enrol the child in clubs and societies
- o Teach the child to observe other children to indicate what to do
- o Encourage co-operative and competitive games
- o Model how to relate to the child
- o Explain alternative means of seeking assistance
- o Encourage prospective friendships
- o Provide enjoyment at break times
- o Be aware of two characters
- o Obtain teacher aide time
- o Use Social Stories to understand the cues and actions for specific social situations
- o Run social skills groups for adolescents to:
- Rehearse more appropriate options
- Demonstrate inappropriate social behaviour
- Use poetry and autobiographies to encourage self-disclosure and empathy
- Provide guidance and practice in body-language



- o Do projects and activities illustrating the qualities of a good friend
- o To help understand emotions:
- Explore one emotion at a time as a project
- Teach how to read and respond to the cues that indicate several different levels of emotion
- Learn safety phrases when confused
- o To help express emotions:
- Use a "gauge" as a visual guide
- Use videoing and role play to provide more subtle or precise expression
- Use leading questions or a diary to encourage self-disclosure
